

	Fruit Color	Fruit Season	Comments
BLACKBERRY			
Black Satin	Black	Mid	Prolific grower from 4-6'. Thornless.
BLUEBERRY			<i>Blueberries are self-pollinating, but do best as cross-pollinators.</i>
Blue Crop	Blue	Mid	Moderately hardy, reliable bush. Light blue, tart berry.
Blue Ray	Blue	Mid	Early ripening, firm, sweet fruit on fairly hardy bush.
North Country	Blue	Early	Dark green foliage turns scarlet in fall. Medium size fruit with a sweet wild flavor. Best where snow cover is reliable.
North Blue	Blue	Mid	Red foliage in fall; large fruit. Heavy bearing, high quality. Super hardy.
CURRANT			<i>Currants are self-pollinating, prefer afternoon shade and slightly acid soils. Med-large light red berries are best when cooked.</i>
Red Lake	Glossy Red	Summer	Medium-sized red berries. Vigorous, high yielding, producing on two- to three-year wood.
GOOSEBERRY			<i>Gooseberries are self-pollinating, prefer afternoon shade and slightly acid soils. Med-size green berries that ripen to light pink.</i>
Pixwell	Green/Pink	Summer	½"-¾" light green berries mature to a light rose blush. Hardy, adapt to Colorado's high elevations.
GRAPE			<i>Grapes are self-pollinating and do best in full sun. Water well until established (2-4 years) but once established they do not need water unless dry for 60 days or more. Do not overhead water.</i>
Canadice Seedless	Red	Mid	Rich, robust red. Disease resistant, great for dessert, jelly or wine.
Concord	Blue/Black	Mid	Rich, distinctive flavor used for table, juice, jelly & wine.
Concord Seedless	Blue	Mid	Just right for jelly making. Smaller clusters than Concord.
Glenora Seedless	Blue/Black	Mid. Aug.	Extremely hardy, good for jams, jellies and sauces.
Himrod Seedless	White/Gold	August	Cool green table grape. Crisp and fruity as wine, or dried.
HORSERADISH	White	Sept.	Roots are ground to make condiment.
RASPBERRY			<i>Raspberries are self-pollinating and do best in full sun.</i>
Fall Gold	Yellow	Summer	Keeps producing until frost. Honey sweet & juicy. Everbearer.
Heritage	Red	Summer	No pruning! Mow down the canes after frost! Everbearer.
Latham	Red	June/July	Premium quality, large fruit-excellent for canning and freezing.
RHUBARB			<i>Rhubarb does best in morning sun and afternoon shade.</i>
Canadian	Dark Red	Spring	Sweet-deep red stalks. Water freely.
Valentine	Red	Spring	Large stalks. Water Freely.
STRAWBERRY			
Allstar	Red	SB	Spring-bearer; large, sweet fruit that works well for fresh eating or canning.
Fort Laramie	Red	EB	Very cold hardy and heavy bearing. Firm, bright red fruit.
Ozark Beauty	Red	EB	Most popular everbearing. Tops in berry size and production.
Quinalt	Red	EB	Very sweet, medium sized berries.
