Variety	Species	Key'	Ht.	Description
ALOE	barbadensis	P	12-24"	Succulent. Fleshy leaves containing juices used for burns, bites, etc.
BASIL	Ocimum basilium	A	24"	<i>Flavor tomato dishes, soups, sauces, meats, herb butters, and vinegars. Use for border planting.</i>
Bush				Similar to Spicy Globe; compact.
Cinnamon				Spicy cinnamon-scented.
Genovese				Intensely scented strain of Sweet Basil. Popular with gourmet markets.
Holy				Clove-scented.
Red Rubin				Fragrant, burgundy leaves
Spicy Globe				Compact growth, spicy, good for pots.
Sweet				White flowers; bright green leaves.
Thai, Siam Queen				Narrow, fragrant, mid-green leaves to 4".
BORAGE	Borago officinalis	A	24"	Coarse-textured with unusual purplish-blue star-shaped flowers. Cucumber flavored leaves used in beverages, soups, and salads. Attracts bees.
CARAWAY	Carum carvi	B	24"	Fine textured foliage used to flavor soups & salads. Seeds flavor breads, cheeses, and cakes.
CATNIP	Nepeta cataria	P	36"	Lemony-mint scented leaves with white/lavender flowers mid-summer. Used for teas. Plant attracts cats. Sprinkle crumbled catnip leaves on shelves, doorways to discourage ants.
CHAMOMILE				
German	Matricaria recutita	A	24"	Smaller flowers and less strongly scented than Roman Chamomile, but its use is the same.
Roman	Anthemis nobilis	P	4"	White daisy-like flower on a 10" stalk. Makes feathery ground cover; will take light traffic and mowing. Pungent apple scent. Flowers used in teas and hair rinses to lighten hair.
CHIVES				
Garlic	Allium tuberosum	P	12"	Use when mild garlic flavor is required. Good with cheese, eggs, sauces and salads.
Regular	Allium schoenoprasum	P	12"	Rose flowers on stalks in June make an attractive border plant in a perennial garden. Add onion flavor leaves to soups, salads, sauces, butter, vinegar, meat and cheese dishes.
CORIANDER				
Cilantro, Chinese Parsley	Coriandrum sativum	B	24-36"	Delicate foliage with clusters of mauve flowers in early spring. Leaves flavor salads, soups, stews, and Mexican and Chinese dishes (Cilantro). Lemon-flavored seeds are used for cakes, cookies and pastries (Coriander).
CURRY	Helichrysum angustifolium	P	12"	Gray, woolly leaves have a delightful curry fragrance. Produces clusters of yellow flowers in summer that are excellent dried. Good rock garden plant. (Not the same as the spice.)
DILL				
Fern Leaf	Anethum graveolens	A	18"	Excellent flavor. Dark, finely divided foliage on basal-branching plants. AAS Winner.
Regular	Anethum graveolens	A	36"	Feathery foliage with yellowish flowers. Leaves and seeds used in pickles, vinegars, soups and salads.
FENNEL				
Regular	Foeniculum vulgare	A	48"	Finely textured leaves with small bright yellow flowers in summer. Licorice flavored seeds and leaves used in pickles, Italian breads, meat, fish, egg and cheese dishes. Young stems used like celery. Good background plant.
Bronze	Foeniculum vulgare	A	48"	Delicately cut foliage in deep smokey-bronze. Same uses as above.
GARLIC				
Regular	Allium sativum	P	18"	Spherical clusters of pinkish flower stalks bloom early summer. Cloves flavor salads and cooked dishes.
Society	Tulbaghia violace	P	18"	Clusters of lilac flowers on a long stalk. Strong aroma makes it a good aphid repellent.
Society, variegated		P	18"	Variegated form of the above Society Garlic. Same strong aroma.
GERANIUMS, SCENTED	Pelargonium species	A	24"	<i>Delightfully scented foliage with leaves coming in a wide range of shapes and sizes. Provide at least 4 hours of sunlight daily and well drained soil. Do not over water! Pinch growing tips to maintain bushy, compact plants. They do well in containers. Leaves are used to flavor cold drinks, teas, jellies, and desserts. Used in finger bowls. Excellent in sachets and potpourris. Place pat of butter on leaves or crush a handful in a hot bath.</i>
Cinnamon Rose				Rose-pink blooms, rose and cinnamon scented foliage.
Citrosa				Deeply cut green leaf, citronella fragrance.
Ginger				Roundish leaves with a sweet ginger scent.
Lemon Rose				Pink flowers; lemon-rose scent.

Mint Rose				Finely cut, slightly variegated leaves with minty-rose scent.
Nutmeg				Nutmeg-scented.
Old Fashioned Rose				Single pink flower; skeleton-like foliage; rose scented.
Pink Champagne				Bright pink flowers with fine champagne scented foliage.
Strawberry				Two-toned pink flowers; strawberry scented foliage.
Wildwood				Pink flowers; deep woody scented oakleaf-shaped foliage.
GINGER - 4"	Zingiber officinale	A	2-3'	Fragrant foliage. Excellent remedy for digestive problems, motion and morning sickness.
GOTU KOLA	Centella asiatica	P	6"	This plant prefers a shady location, producing a large quantity of leaves that make tasty salad greens. It is said to strengthen the memory, which is maybe why it is a favorite food of Asian elephants!
HOREHOUND	Marrubium vulgare	P	36"	Wooly gray leaves w/small white flowers. Strong minty leaves flavor honey, teas, pastries, cough syrups & candy.
HYSSOP	Hyssopus officinalis	P	24"	Semi-evergreen, with deep blue-violet flowers on spikes June-August. Used in teas, perfumes and liqueurs. Clipped to form low hedges in informal perennial gardens. Good cut flowers.
LAVENDER				
Lavender Lady	Lavandula angustifolia	P	8-10"	Fast grower - blooms first season. AAS WINNER.
French	Lavandula dentata	TP	12-36"	Delightful lavender fragrance. Good indoor window plant. Used for sachets and potpourris.
Spanish	Lavandula stoechas	TP	12"	Shrubby, semi-evergreen fine gray-green foliage with deep purple flowers in early summer. Good pot plant. Used in sachets, potpourris.
LEEKs	Allium porrum	B	24-36"	Purple globular flower second season; distinctive mild onion flavor. Use fresh or dry in soups and sauces.
LEMON BALM	Melissa officinalis	P	36"	Light green lemon-scented leaves flavor soups, salads, fish and vegetables, cold drinks and teas. Serves as a fragrant background plant in perennial borders. Attracts bees.
LEMON VERBENA	Lippia citridora	TP	24"	Semi-evergreen; strong lemon scent used in drinks, teas, and in potpourris and perfumes.
MARJORAM				
Sweet (Green)	Origanum marjorana	A	12"	Small white flowers August-September. Tiny gray-green leaves with spicy scent flavor meats, poultry, fish, stuffings and sauces. Also scents sachets and soaps. Great potted plant.
Variegated		A	12"	Yellow and green variegated foliage.
MINT	Mentha species			<i>Mint is a popular herb known for its cool, fresh fragrance. It is also known for its use in flavoring sweet dishes such as teas, custard, jellies, ice cream, candies, juleps, and fruit dishes. Mint spreads very rapidly and should be planted away from the main garden area.</i>
Apple	M. rountundifolia	P	18"	Large woolly green leaves; sweet apple mint scent.
Candy	M. spp.	P	4-6"	Variation of peppermint with sweeter flavor and scent. Shade/part shade.
Chocolate	M. spp.	P	4-6"	The bronzy-green leaves actually have a chocolate fragrance. A real hit with children.
Corsican	M. requienii	P	1-2"	Low creeping growth with tiny lavender flowers in summer. Sun or part shade. Needs some
Lime	M. spp.	P	4-6"	Wonderful lime scent and flavor. Good in summer drinks.
Orange	M. piperata citrata	P	12-24"	Bronzy-green foliage with strong citrus mint scent.
Peppermint	M. piperata	P	12"	Drought tolerant. Strong mint flavor. Oil flavors candy, chewing gum and medicine.
Pineapple	M. suaveolens var.	P	10"	Leaves with white markings and faint fragrance of pineapple. Dried leaves used in sachets and potpourris.
Spearmint	M. spicata	P	24"	Cool mint flavor. Classic ingredient of mint juleps.
OREGANO				
Common	Origanum vulgare	P	3"	Long lasting pale pink flowers July-Sept. Creeping dark green foliage. Seasoning for
Golden	Origanum vulgare aureum	P	3"	White flowers with creeping yellow-green foliage.
Greek	Origanum vulgare	P	12-24"	Large, dark green pungent leaves. More upright in growth.
Italian	Origanum onites	P	24"	Small light green leaves; has a sweeter flavor than other oreganos.
Mexican	Lippia graveolens	TP	12-24"	Most commonly used herb for commercial oregano.
PARSLEY				
Curled	Petroselinum crispum	B	12"	Curled dark green leaves with celery scent. Leaves used as garnish to flavor meat, fish, potatoes, and soups.
Italian (Flat)	Petroselinum neapolitanum	B	12"	Flat leaves with stronger flavor; superior in cooked dishes. Both Parsleys make excellent border plants.

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PENNYROYAL	<i>Mentha pulegium</i>	P	3"	Creeping growth habit, growing best in cool, moist areas. Strong mint flavored leaves used in sauces, puddings, and herb remedies. Natural insect repellent.
ROSEMARY				
Arp	<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	TP	24"	Tender, but more hardy than regular officinalis.
Blue Spires	<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	TP	4'	Nicely branched shrub with upright habit, showy clear blue flowers.
Regular	<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	TP	24"	Evergreen with pale blue-lavender flowers; tolerates poor soil. Sharp pine scented leaves flavor meats, vegetables, poultry, stuffing, bread, tea, vinegar and butters. Flowers and leaves used in sachets and potpourris. Used as hedging; also attractive bonsai.
Tuscan Blue	<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	TP	3'	Upright habit, can be trained as a hedge, bright lavender blue flowers.
Weeping	<i>Rosmarinus prostratus</i>	TP	6"	Trailing dark green foliage with pale blue-lavender flowers.
RUE	<i>Ruta graveolens</i>	P	36"	A shrubby evergreen with blue-green fern-like foliage and yellow flowers June-Aug. Its bitter leaves used for an antiseptic and disinfectant. Unusual blue-green accent in garden; low hedge in formal garden.
SAGE				
Garden	<i>S. officinalis</i>	P	24"	Violet flowers in June; woolly gray leaves with peppery scent flavor poultry, pork, sausage, tea and cheese.
Golden Icterina	<i>S. officinalis</i>	P	24"	Golden variegated leaves. Used the same as Garden Sage.
Lavender		P	18"	Prostrate with silvery leaves, lavender scented.
Pineapple	<i>S. rutinand</i>	TP	36"	Scarlet flowers with pineapple scented leaves. Use in salads and butters. Excellent houseplant.
Purple	<i>S. officinalis</i>	P	18"	Compact aromatic purple foliage. Use like garden sage.
Variegated Tricolor	<i>S. officinalis</i>	P	24"	Showy red, green and white foliage. Use the same as Garden Sage.
SAVORY				
Summer	<i>Satureja hortensis</i>	A	18"	Lilac-pink flowers with bushy growth. Spicy peppery leaves flavor meat, fish, poultry, potatoes & veggies.
Winter	<i>Satureja montana</i>	P	12"	Semi-evergreen with white flowers in summer. Sharper flavor than Summer Savory, but used the same.
TARRAGON, French	<i>Artemisia dracunculus</i>	P	24"	Fine-textured dark green foliage that rarely flowers. Prefers poor, dry soil. Leaves flavor steaks, seafood, chicken, sauces, salads, marinades and vinegars.
THYME (Upright)				
English	<i>Thymus vulgaris</i>	P	6-12"	Tiny lavender flowers June-July. Fragrant, gray-green leaves. Culinary variety. Sun.
Golden Lemon	<i>Thymus vulgaris</i>	P	15"	Leaves edged in yellow add contrast to the annual or perennial or herb garden.
Silver	<i>Thymus vulgaris</i>	P	18"	Excellent in rock gardens. Adds flavor to cottage cheese, meats and shellfish.

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
